Dear Miss Schmidt:

Mrs. Rella Shwartz, an attorney in town, has called me on behalf of the Fund of the Republic study of security and loyalty proceedings under Executive Order No. 10450. The study as you know is financed by Ford Foundation funds. The person presently heading it is, I believe, Adam Yarmolinsky. I know nothing more about it than what has appeared in the papers. Rella Shwartz tells me that the cases will be reported in a manner which will not reveal any names, and will make such variations as may be necessary to prevent cases from being identified. Any report made on any case will be submitted for approval before it is included in the study, so that if there is objection to the report it can be withdrawn.

Will you consent to having your case examined by Miss Shwartz for the purpose of preparing a report for this study?

I should like to get your comments on this, even though it may be a little early to make any final decision. I believe that we should know a little more about the Fund of the Republic study before we make any final decision. I understand that Mr. Yarmolinsky is still in the process of working out his clearances with the Department of Justice.
