Dear Miss Schmidt: Mrs. Rella Shwartz, an attorney in town, has called me on behalf of the Fund of the Republic study of security and loyalty proceedings under Executive Order No. 10450. The study as you know is financed by Ford Foundation funds. The person presently heading it is, I believe, Adam Yarmolinsky. I know nothing more about it than what has appeared in the papers. Rella Shwartz tells me that the cases will be reported in a manner which will not reveal any names, and will make such variations as may be necessary to prevent cases from being identified.
